# ABOUT THE PROJECT

This project seeks to fulfil a need that has been recognized by youth workers and young leaders from AMJE<sup>1</sup> and partner organizations. Namely, that:

- There is inadequate knowledge of human rights foundations among young people
- There is lack of involvement of young people in human rights-related topics, which prevents them from engaging in human rights talk
- There is lack of know-how in youth organisations to address human rights from both a theoretical and practical perspectives

## OBJECTIVES

- To develop knowledge among 28 new youth workers about the Human Rights from the most relevant documents for the European Youth, like new 11 EU Youth Goals or European Youth Strategy
- To empower 28 youth workers for critical writing and defending Human Rights, to develop media literacy and digital skills of filming short videos in order to become an ambassador for the rights of the youth at the national levels of Europe

- To produce 1 strategy that is improving young people's access to rights at National level of Europe and that helps the youth workers to follow the implementation of the new European Youth Strategy and work of National Youth Councils

## OTHER INFORMATION

**About Madrid:** Madrid is located in the center of the Iberian Peninsula. It is the capital city of Spain, and the third-largest city in the EU, only smaller than London and Berlin, with 3.2 million inhabitants and 6.5 in its metropolitan area. As the capital city, it is home to the Spanish Government and the Spanish Royal family. Some of the largest and most important Spanish universities are in Madrid, such as the Complutense University or the Autonoma University. Madrid has a lot of interesting attractions that offer both culture and amusement.

The city is full of great monuments, like the Royal Palace, the Almudena Cathedral or the Plaza Mayor, and for art lovers, the museums Del Prado, Reina Sofia or Thyssen have some breathtaking collections of famous Spanish painters like Velazquez, Goya, Picasso or Miro.

**Insurance:** The *European Health Insurance Card* is valid in Spain and it is recognized in all medical centers. In case you have the card, you do not need to have additional insurances. If not, participants are required to have insurance cover for the entire duration of the project. Insurance is obligatory for your safety and health.
